"I Believe - - - In The Resurrection of the Dead"

We take these words directly from the Apostle's Creed that we recite frequently. Why is this a part of our confession? It is because we take it directly from scripture, 1 Cor. 15:3-4, 1 Thess. 4:14-18 (and many others).

The gospel writers who experienced the resurrection first bless us with the most wonderful, profound words as they visited the empty tomb. "He is not here; he is risen just as he said."

This is why it is a vital part of our confession and why we celebrate every first day of the week. The living Jesus is our life!

Initially, the disciples and the women were shattered at Jesus death. None of them who experienced that first Easter morning had believed it. Not the disciples, not the women; certainly not the centurion guard, or the authorities.

In those dark days before Jesus had risen, it was not the bright day of rejoicing as it is now for us. The one they had lived, walked, worked, and eaten with was brutally tortured and then crucified. Here are a couple of points we can take into consideration.

1. The disciples unbelief was fed by fair but false assumptions.

Roman soldiers do their jobs thoroughly and completely. No one gets off their crosses alive. Jesus being alive again was a human impossibility. Dead men don't walk, and talk, or eat. This is where the power of the resurrection confronts them. Acts 2:24 tells us what it was impossible for Jesus to do. It was "impossible for death to keep its hold on Jesus" by virtue of who he was.

2. Their unbelief was driven by despair.

They were in mourning and audible weeping. Grief has a way of numbing you to reality. Some things are just too difficult to take in all at once. Jesus had told the disciples many times that he was going to die but that he would rise again also. They had selective hearing and were unable to grasp what Jesus had told them. After they understood the depth of what had happened though, they were finally in a position to hear and see and be deeply transformed by the resurrection of Jesus. Chicago pastor and writer Erwin Lutzer puts it this way. He said "before Jesus appeared in the room with the disciples, all they could remember was **Iron, Wood, and Blood**. A tragic end to a beautiful life! But then, Jesus showed himself to them alive. Now they saw **Face, Body, and Scars**." Jesus shows up dissipating their fears and doubts like the morning mist.

3. Their unbelief included insurmountable obstacles.

Mark's gospel alone gives us the dialogue that happened among the women on the way to the tomb, Mark 16:1-3. They were deeply worried about how they were going to roll the stone away. This was not a concern they needed to worry about though. The women could have been packing anywhere from 60-100 pounds of spices to prepare Jesus body for permanent burial. Then, the angels words to them: "why seek the living among the dead"? Not only was the heavy stone rolled away but Jesus' body was no longer there. John's gospel uses a phrase in Greek indicating the stone was lifted up and out of its place. This could have been up to 2 tons in weight. We might say "sorry" to Mary and the other women; your job is not needed.

Someone has wisely noted, the stone wasn't rolled away to let Jesus out but to let his doubting disciples **in** so that they might see and believe and be astounded at the truth Jesus had predicted many times.

We repeat the glad Easter confession once again: "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!"

Council went into Executive Session.


