Building Spiritual Community

Some time ago I remember walking into a Starbucks coffee shop. While waiting there, I noticed a brochure near the front where I would pay for my beverage. It said, "Come To Starbucks and Create Community." Wow, what a claim. To think that if you patronize their business or work there, you will experience community! I suppose it is possible to go with friends, colleagues, or family and enjoy a sense of socialization, or loosely defined community. There are many other types of "communities" that exist. So, what would cause people around us to think of "Christian community" as different than the others?

Scripture teaches that the church of Christ gathered constitutes true, deep, lasting community that can mediate the grace of God. Jesus formed a community around himself, animating it and leaving it with his Spirit and his Word. The basis of our fellowship and communion is our shared life in Christ. As the church we are to be the life pulsating people animated by the indwelling presence of Christ.

The metaphor that dominates the most in the New Testament is that the church is the "body of Christ", Romans 12:4-21, I Cor. 12:12-27, Ephesians 4:3-16. The Christian writer and counselor Larry Crabb called the church "the safest place on earth but also the most dangerous." This is because, as he notes "that everything in spiritual community is reversed from the world's order. It is our weakness, not our competence, the



world's order. It is our weakness, not our competence, that moves others; our sorrows, not our blessings, that break down the barriers of fear and shame that keep us apart; our admitted failures, not our paraded successes, that bind us together in hope."

In his book <u>The Holy Longing</u> the author Ronald Rolheiser helps us to know why this is certainly the case. I think you can see along with me that his points are undeniable in that we have all experienced these things in our faith community or church. "We come with different backgrounds, temperaments, and different ideas of what Jesus is about. Sometimes we would never pick some folks in our church as our personal friends. Sometimes we are jealous with each other and even furious with each other. We are not going to find ideal soulmates in the sense that we always agree with each other or will be ideologically, emotionally, or otherwise compatible. In the same community where you find holiness, grace, sanctity, and fidelity, you also find sin, pettiness, and betrayal. No church extends the grace of God perfectly. *What we can and should do, though is to stand shoulder to shoulder and hand in hand, precisely with people who are very different from us and, with them, hear a common word, confess a common creed, share a common bread, and offer a mutual forgiveness to bridge our differences and become a common heart."*

We may not even notice it at first, but the New Testament, especially Paul's letters are filled with examples of this. They are phrases that use what is called the reciprocal pronoun. They are the "one-another's" used over 50 times. Spiritual community is built in the generous giving and receiving of the body's organic, corporate action and sharing with one another. Some examples: love, serve, bear with, forgive, admonish, accept, comfort, and encourage one another. It is impossible for this to happen without being in community with one another. How can you forgive, encourage, or accept each other without close, sometimes intimate contact? "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." *Continued on page 3*

President Kris Gernstein called the April 16, 2024, Trinity Lutheran Church Council meeting to order.

Guest Tom Zimmerman presented a video from a group called "Esprit de Corps"; a performing arts group based out of the Lincoln Berean Church consisting of 65 high school students sharing Jesus through high energy music/drama. After the video, discussion was held on whether Council would endorse Trinity hosting this group for one (1) performance on Tuesday, July 9th. There would be no cost to attend this concert. Location of the performance at Trinity or CMS Nantkes Performing Arts Center and responsibilities of Trinity were highlighted. Tom Zimmerman agreed to head this committee on other details. Discussion to continue.

A thank-you was received from Sheepgate, a women's recovery center located in Beatrice, Nebraska, for Trinity's generous donation.

The Offering Pickup Schedule was passed around and completed for May.

The minutes for the March 19, 2024, Council meeting and the March 20, 2024, email vote were approved. Financial reports for period ending March 31, 2024, were approved.

Business Administrator Report

- HVAC: Update was given at meeting that the rooftop units would be installed April 17. .
- High School Classroom Project: The Columbus Carpet bid was accepted and approved. Carpet has been ordered. No installation date has been set up. The lights should be in any day.
- Fence: The bid from Schumacher Fencing was accepted and approved. The building inspector examined the property for permit. Tremel Surveying marked the property lines. A permit was issued for the following fence along the east side of the parking lot: On the North end, we will have no fence for the first 6' (for visibility), then 4' tall for 14', then 6'. On the South side, we will have a 4' fence for 20', then 6' fence for the remainder. There will be a 6' fence around the garbage dumpsters with a gate.
- Office Coverage: Michele has started back to work.
- Four-Wheeler: The four-wheeler from Raise the Roof event was sold by the winner. requiring a clarification on the title.

Old Business:

- Sign: The sign on the southwest lawn continues to be coordinated with City of Columbus due to signage ordinance being rewritten. Progress is being made. Once the ordinance has been approved, we will get a copy and proceed with ideas on a new sign.
- Pastoral Transition Team: Pastor Billy advised Council that an offer has been made on a house. The Pastoral Transition Team continues to work with them for assistance and a smooth transition.
- Photo Wall of Pastors: Kris will touch base with Todd Connelly on removing the previous pastor photos. The display will be stored for later placement. The Fireside Room is an option.
- Landon Sliva Internship: Following much discussion it was determined that Pastor Hall and Landon would meet to hold a dialogue on Landon's plan for the future. More Council discussion to follow.
- Kaleb Andersen's Farewell for May 19 is under preparation.

New Business:

- Christian Education Scholarship Fund Team Members to consist of the Executive Council to review the scholarship applications, which are due May 1. Executive Council is the President, Vice-President, Treasurer and another Council member. This 4th person changes every year. For the 2024/2025 term, Mike Kruse will be the 4th Executive Council Member.
- Rescue Mission Golf Tournament: Trinity will be donating \$500 for a full-hole sponsorship for the event held on July 19.
- Council Retreat: A Council Retreat, led by Pastor Billy Czapla, is to be held on April 19th @ 4 pm at Cheryl Brewer's house. Numbers 13:1-33 and Luke Chapter 15 encapsulates the topics of this session.
- Pastor Hall's Finale: Pastor Hall advised council that his last day will be June 30th. He does plan on leaving after the church service that day. Arrangements and assistance to be given. See Kay Johnson to volunteer.



6th Grade Breakout Graduates






What an honor to serve with young people who are growing in faith & desire to serve.



HVAC UPGRADES

After a very successful Raise the Roof campaign, individual donations, generous gifts from Endowment, and a long wait for our rooftop units to come in, phase one of our HVAC upgrades have been completed! Last fall a glycol tank was installed so that we could run either heat or air conditioning at anytime during the year. Previously there was an entire shut down of air conditioning to turn over to heat and vice versa. The second part of phase one was replacing three roof top units as the previous units had either exceeded their lifetime or were close to their lifetime expectancy. These were finally installed the week of April 15. With these improvements we will be able to control the climate in our building more efficiently throughout the year. 
